Schenectady, NY, April 20th, 2023 - YWCA NorthEastern NY is pleased to announce the ribboncutting ceremony for the new location of their professional development program, YW STRIVE. Formerly the upstairs meeting/conference space for the Palette Community in Schenectady, YWCA NENY will rent the location to create space for their growing programs. The ceremony will take place on April 20th, 2023, at 3:00 PM, at the new location of 508 State St., Schenectady, NY.

The YW STRIVE program is a free, 16-week professional and workforce development program that provides training and support to individuals in Schenectady County. The program offers career exploration, job readiness, resume building, financial literacy, and digital literacy training to help participants achieve their goals and become self-sufficient. YW STRIVE is designed to serve low-income women and people of color in Schenectady County, however, YWCA NENY accepts men and non-binary persons as well. The program recently expanded into the county jail as well. The new location provides a larger space for the growing program and YWCA NENY's professional clothing boutique.

"We are excited to celebrate the opening of our new location for the YW STRIVE program and grateful to the Palette team for this opportunity," said **Kim Siciliano, CEO of YWCA NorthEastern NY**. "This new space will allow us to expand our services and provide more individuals with the skills and support they need to succeed in the workforce and in life in a central location that is brimming with charisma and empowerment".
